

Vox Liminis Overview

We are an arts and community organisation working within criminal justice – sparking fresh conversations and insights so that our responses to crime, harm and conflict might (re)build connections, trust and belonging rather than further divisions.

Established in 2013, we work across Scotland and beyond. Based in Glasgow's east end, we run creative projects in prison and in the wider community with people who have committed crimes, people who have been victims of crime, those who have family experience of crime and justice processes and others who work in this area. Our work is based on community development principles, and includes music, songwriting, creative writing, visual arts and theatre making.

Behind all the above, we are building a creative community called Unbound, made up of many of the diverse people involved. And we are learning a lot together in the process.

Our Vision: A society that responds to crime, harm and conflict in ways that build or rebuild connections, trust and belonging, providing justice, peace and security for all.

At the highest level, our current strategic goals are:

The successful post-holder will be someone who has significant experience in community work practice, thinks strategically and critically, and has held substantial responsibility for the development of people and projects.

This is a senior practice facing role, in an organisation where strategy, practice and theory intertwine.

Working hours will be 37.5 hours per week, incorporating a high degree of flexibility. This is a permanent post, with a salary in the region of £40,000 per year, based on experience.

Job Description Community Development Lead

In accordance with good practice and high-quality creative community development approaches, and in line with Vox Liminis' 'Values in Action', the Community Development Lead will have responsibility in the following areas:

Developing practice

- Grow community learning cultures within the staff team, freelancer/sessional team, the Unbound community, and projects
- Grow strategic networks in justice, arts and community practice
- Look for potential, and dot-join within existing practice and in potential new practice areas
- Support team to keep developing within the work they lead, in line with strategy
- Grow consciousness and critical thinking around systemic issues
- Explore what activism and systemic change can look like in creative, diverse community-led ways
- Explore critically and collaboratively the interface between the Unbound Community and Vox Liminis as an organisation, and ways towards more collective ownership and responsibility
- Work within and manage complex risks

Developing people

- Notice potential and support the development of people (team and community members) in ways that fit with their passions, skills and abilities
- Support team members to develop people in the work they are involved in
- Train and mentor others in reflective critical community development practice

Developing projects

 Explore and develop new ideas, funding opportunities, and potential partnerships (practice and strategic)

Developing communications

 Lead work with other staff, community members and participants (bringing in budgeted external expertise where appropriate) to develop external communications (written, video, photo) that make explicit our learning, principles and vision for different audiences, and bring people into it in participatory ways
